

## Risk Assessment for Activities at Jubilee Wood

Note: This assessment to read in conjunction with the Site Risk Assessment

Description of Hazard	Description of Potential Harm	Risk Level (Before Controls)	Prevention and controls to reduce Risk/Hazard	Residual Risk (ie risk level once controls are in place)
Trip hazards around site	tripping over fallen branches, brambles or uneven ground	Low	Walk site each day and remove obvious hazards. Warn visitors of the natural hazards found in the countryside. Advise them to ensure they come with suitable clothing and footwear.	Trivial
Dog walkers, members of the public (if appropriate)	Abduction/abuse of children  Uncontrolled dogs	low	Be aware of any unfamiliar adults seen on site and ask them to leave.  If encountered in Biss Wood encourage them to walk in a different part of the wood, along the way-marked rides. Stress that dogs must be kept under control at all times. Wiltshire Wildlife require all dogs to be kept on a lead  Scout guidelines to be followed. Carry out regular head counts. Leaders to wear uniform.	Low
Overhead pylons ( if appropriate)	Risk of electric shock	Low	If visiting the north-east corner of the site, Warn visitors not to touch pylons or throw anything near the power lines,	Low

Pond, Ditches and stream	falling in	Medium	Warn visitors not to go near ditches and not to paddle in the pond or the stream as the sides are steep and slippery. All group activities to be supervised by an adult.	Low
Archery butts	falling	low	Under no circumstances are children to climb the structure. It is designed to catch arrows and not as a climbing frame	Low
Ticks	Lyme's disease	low	Warn parents to check children for ticks and to seek medical attention if a tick bite begins to swell. Leaflets and a tick removal tool are kept in the hut.	Low
Barbed wire	cuts	low	Instruct children to use the gates	trivial
